#### Abstract

Flex the Brain Bilingual children who have been exposed to a second language from an early age proved to have the greyest matter of all. Grey matter is responsible for processing information, including memory, speech and sensory perception. And if it can be increased by exposure to a second language, then language learning would be just like taking your brain to the gym!

Speak Naturally Children are always mimicking what they hear, and are surprisingly good at it! They are uniquely attuned to slight differences in tone and sound. Their sensitive ears help them pick up on and duplicate the tricky sounds adults and even adolescents often stumble over. By starting early, your children can speak smoothly and confidently from the first.

> Gain Opportunities As the economy is becoming more and more globalized, bilingual education is an added bonus when applying to scholarships, colleges and jobs. Studying, working or living abroad means having more skills by which to market yourself with.

> Expand Vocabulary Vocabulary expansion is expected for children who are exposed to a second language. Comparing the second language to their native languages provides them with an opportunity to examine their native language systematically by reinforcing concepts and terms.
